	<u>v. 24</u> - God <u>heard</u> their groaning and He <u>remembered</u> His covenant with Abraham with Isaac and with Jacob. So God <u>looked</u> on the Israelites and <u>acknowledged</u> them.
	<u>Daniel 9:21-23</u> - While I was praying, Gabriel, whom I'd seen in the earlier vision came swiftly to me about the time of the evening sacrifice. He explained to me "Daniel, I've come here to give you insight and understanding. <u>The moment you began praying</u> , a command was given. And now I'm here to tell you what it was, for you're very precious to God."
