1. The Tongue Has Power To Direct
<u>v. 3-5</u> - Indeed, we put bits in horses' mouths that they may obey us, and we <u>turn</u> their whole body. (A tiny, one pound bit can turn a 1,200 pound horse.) ⁴ Look also at ships: although they're so large and are driven by fierce winds, they're <u>turned</u> by a very small rudder wherever the pilot desires. ⁵ Even so the tongue is a little member and boasts great things.
<u>2 Samuel 16:7-9</u> - As he cursed, Shimei said, "Get out of here, you murderer, you scoundrel! The LORD has repaid you for all the blood you shed in the household of Saul, in whose place you've reigned. The LORD has given the kingdom into the hands of your son Absalom.
